PUBLIC AND PRIVATE LAWS OF NORTH CAROLINA 1883 CHAPTER 61

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE TOWN OF GLEN ALPINE, IN THE

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

SECTION 1. That the citizens of the territory hereinafter specified, embracing Glen Alpine station, on the Western North Carolina Railroad, in Burke county, be and the same is hereby incorporated under the name and style of the town of Glen Alpine.

Sec. 2. That the corporate limits of said town shall be a circle five hundred yards distant in all directions from the station house or depot of said railroad.

Sec. 3. That the officers of said town shall consist of a mayor and five commissioners, and a marshall to be appointed by the commissioners, and until the first Monday in May, eighteen hundred and eighty-three, W. T. Bowden shall fill the office of mayor, and Henry Brinkley, Alfred Bright, James F. Knott, J. I. Sigman and James Simpson shall act as commissioners.

Sec. 4. That on the first Monday in May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and each succeeding year thereafter, there shall be held an election for mayor and commissioners for said town, under the same rules and regulations as are or may be established by law for the election of town officers in like corporations in this state.

shall have the power to enact all such by laws, rules

and regulations for the better government of said town as may seem to them just and reasonable, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of North-Carolina or the United States.

Sec. 6. That this act shall be in force from and after its ratification.

In the general assembly read three times, and ratified this the 28th day of February, A. D., 1883.
